




## Project Activities

### Selecting the prospective DICAMP students

Selecting the prospective DICAMP Students The DICAMP Master Programme has been advertised in the daily newspaper "La Press" inviting those who are interested to submit their application. By the end of August DICAMP received 957 applications and around 120 candidates were shortlisted for the interview. The selection criterion for a shortlist was based on the applicants' scores in:

- Academic degree,
- Mark of the final exams,
- English marks during the study and English language skills at work,
- Leading functions in their profession,
- Work experience (occupation years).


Three jury teams each with three jurors conducted the interviews of the 120 applicants. The jurors were representatives of the three universities IHEC, ESSEC, and ENIT. They were led by Prof. Dr. Olfa Zribi (Institut des Hautes Etudes Commerciales Carthage, IHEC), Prof. Dr. Zeineb Mamlouk (Ecole Sup. des Sciences Economiques et Commerciales de Tunis, ESSEC) and Prof. Dr. Ralf Reichwald (Ecole Nationale d'Ingénieurs de Tunis, ENIT). Each of the selection interviews were conducted both in French and in English. At the interviews, the candidates had to outperform in the following aspects: - The score of the above-named criteria, - Previous knowledge in leading professions, - Occupational availability, - Quality of English skills. 30 students received a place for the first generation of DICAMP students. Anyone who is interested in the master programme or those who want to have a second chance may try again next year for the second enrollment.
